Stigma Activity 1.1: Work with communities to reframe HIV services and HIV-related messaging so that they do not stigmatize people or behaviors. (NHAS.3.2)

# **Action Steps**

- Support agencies/groups with stigma funding to partner Storytellers with Marketing Teams to create forms of media with community members for community members that they can listen to, read, or watch about humanizing HIV. Expand destigmatizing forms of media which can include advertisements, billboards/transit ads, google/eads, posters, pamphlets, podcasts, or social media.

#### **Committee Feedback:**

Michael Hager stated that a synthesis plan for how to collect and disseminate this information in a safe way could be a way to achieve part of this Action Step. He also suggested finding a way to incentivize participants.

The Support Team suggested partnering with the Storytellers, so they are involved in the marketing and better ensure the materials are not stigmatizing.

Monique Springer mentioned the possibility of creating a podcast. She also mentioned the importance of humanizing HIV.

Jose Avila mentioned the importance of involving the community in the implementation of the DOH recommendations. He also mentioned the importance of understanding what is currently happening in NJ and how we can build upon that rather than reinventing the wheel.

Crystal Mitchell responded by saying that a lot of this already exists, so it is about how to reach priority populations/the community.

Stephanie Berroa-Allen suggested that the Committee think about recommending funding go to different agencies/organizations that will be/are doing this work to reach the community.







Crystal Mitchell explained Community PROMISE and how this is something that worked and could be expanded across the state.

Robert Lord-Schell suggested the need for a coalition to do this work.
