### 2023 Recap & 2024 Work Plan

Within this presentation the Support Team also reviewed the formal recommendation from Cycle 1 in 2023 (System 5.5). This recommendation will be presented at the next Executive Committee Meeting where they will be finalized and submitted to the NJDOH. The NJDOH will review and collaborate with NJHPG and NJ Stakeholders to implement the recommendation.

The Support Team then reviewed the Cycle 2 Work Plan for 2024. The Data and Research Committee will be taking on a new role as a data and resource hub. The working Committees will be able to submit data requests to the Data and Research Committee to increase collaboration on DOH Recommendations.

#### **PrEP Presentation**

Rosie Ruiz transitioned to the next part of the Agenda which was a PrEP Presentation by Shwetha







Kamath. This presentation included an overview of 2022 and 2023 PrEP Data. The data was broken down by priority population.

#### **Committee Feedback/Questions:**

Rosie Ruiz pointed out that in the data, no sex workers were reported and that is hard to believe. Shalik Thompson agreed and asked if online sex workers are considered in this data. Karyn Berk asked if there were outreach interventions in place to reach sex workers and provide information on services/resources. Steve Dunagan mentioned that it all comes down to how the individuals responds when they are or are not identifying as a sex worker.

Rosie Ruiz suggested another presentation on PEP.

#### **Data & Resource Hub Review:**

The Support Team presented and reviewed the DRAFT Data & Resource Hub Guidance. This Guidance includes a Goal Section, Resource Section, and Glossary. Once completed, the Data & Resource Hub will be available to other Committees and community members on the NJHPG Website.

Rosie Ruiz recommended having a submission box on the website where community members can request specific data/resources to be added.
