2023 Recap & 2024 Work Plan	The Support Team transitioned to present the Community Engagement Committee 2023 Look Back and 2024 Look Ahead PowerPoint. This presentation started by stating the goal of the Community Engagement Committee.
	Within this presentation the Support Team also reviewed the formal recommendations from Cycle 1 in 2023 ( <b>Program 5.8, Program 5.11, &amp; Program</b> <b>5.13</b> ). These recommendations will be presented at the next Executive Committee Meeting where they will be finalized and submitted to the NJDOH. The NJDOH will review and collaborate with NJHPG and NJ Stakeholders to implement the recommendations.
	The Support Team then reviewed the Cycle 2 Work Plan for 2024. The Community Engagement Committee will be working on 3 assigned Activities: • Stigma 1.1 from January-February • Program 1.2 from March-April • Program 1.3 from May-June
New Business	Stephanie Berroa-Allen transitioned to present the Education Didactic for Stigma Activity 1.1. The presentation started with a definition of stigma followed by a discussion of what stigma means to each of the attendees.
	Stephanie Berroa-Allen then presented what has worked in the past including Stigma Training Programs, Communication, Education, and Normalization of Differences. She then asked attendees to share potential ideas for change.





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Shalik Thompson suggested increasing visibility in nontraditional areas could help reduce stigma. Stephanie Berroa-Allen agreed and added in that normalizing conversation in these areas (barber shops, nail salons, grocery stores) could help as well since this is where a lot of community members go.
Robert Lord-Schell mentioned that meeting people who are living with HIV and sharing stories is another way to decrease stigma.
Michael Hager stated that cultural consumables such as podcasts, TV shows, and movies are ways to eliminate stigma.
Jose Avila mentioned that interventions are typically targeting high-risk populations, but stigma exists in other populations as well. He mentioned that more needs to be done to reach other "status neutral" populations.
Michael Hager stated that when thinking about messaging, it is important to remember that what speaks to one group might trigger another, so purposeful communication is essential.
Jose Avila mentioned that events such as TDL, AWH, or GMAD have been successful in bringing in the community and priority populations while also educating them.
The Support Team shared the Miro Board for collaboration on Stigma 1.1 and attendees began drafting the following recommendations:
<b>Action Steps:</b> 1) Create a database of stories, information & statistics on Stigma. (quantify the stories into




